SLEEP DEPRIVATION AND FATIGUE MANAGEMENT IN ORTHOPAEDICS: IS MANDATORY DISCLOSURE OR DUTY HOUR RESTRICTIONS THE ANSWER?

Moderator: *Jeffrey O. Anglen, MD (Indianapolis, IN)*

In 2004, the ACGME enacted work week duty hour restrictions for residents, limiting their hours to a maximum of 80 per week, in order to protect patients from sleep deprived physicians. This policy has been one of the most controversial topics in medical training in recent years. As an extension of that protection, it has been proposed that practicing surgeons should also have duty hour limits, or at least be required to disclose their sleep status to patients prior to elective procedures. Participants will hear an update on the status and outcome of resident duty hour restrictions, discussion from physicians on either side of the “required disclosure” proposal, and will learn about how operator fatigue is managed and regulated in the transportation field.
