

Orthopaedic Fellowship Opportunity in Musculoskeletal Trauma and Hip Preservation Surgery

A unique training opportunity is available at Duke University Medical Center beginning August 1, 2011.

A one year experience with emphasis in two areas of Orthopaedic Surgery: Orthopaedic Trauma Surgery and Adult Hip Preservation Surgery. The trauma experience includes exposure to pelvic and acetabular fracture reconstruction, management of periarticular injuries, and open fractures. The experience includes exposure to a significant volume of elective procedures including bernese periacetabular osteotomy, surgical hip dislocation, and hip arthroscopy with osteoplasty and labral repair. The program is designed to facilitate the transition of responsibility from chief resident to attending physician throughout the year. The fellow will be expected to participate in attending trauma call at least 3 nights per month. Educational conferences include trauma conference, adult reconstruction conferences, sports medicine conferences, and grand rounds. Participation in clinical research is expected. The opportunity to work with faculty in adult reconstruction or sports medicine in fellowship topic areas is also available. The applicant must be able to obtain a full unrestricted medical license in North Carolina.
